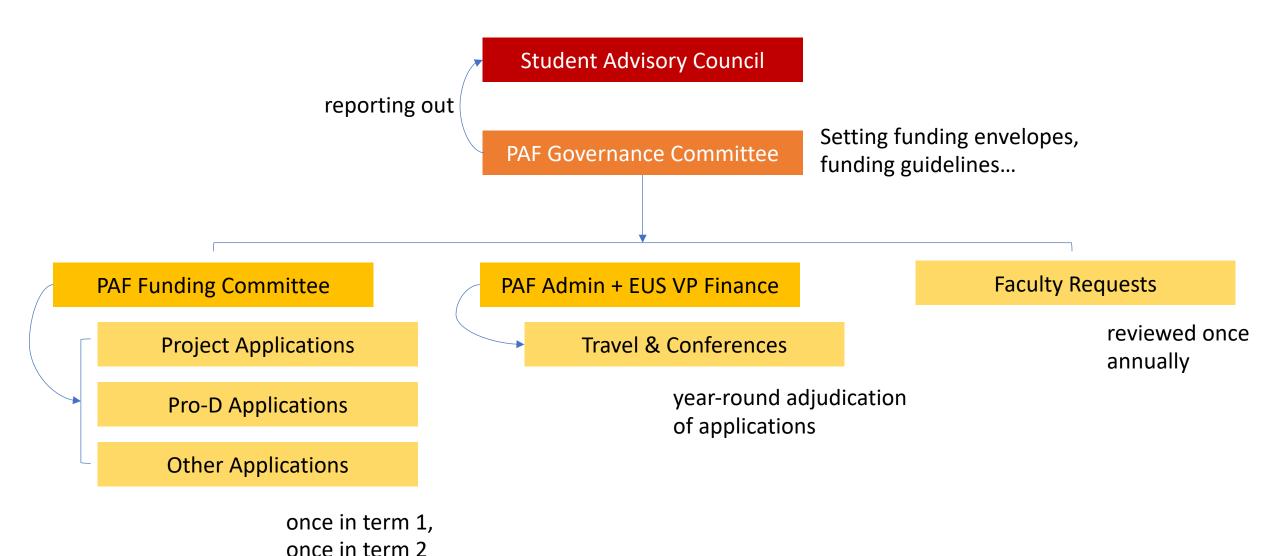




### WHAT IS PAF?

- Professional Activities Fund: "exists to enhance professional development activities through supporting co-curricular experiences"
  - projects, travel & conferences, student teams, PD events...
- \$100/student + CPI (inflation) currently \$116.25
- Administered in joint by EUS & APSC
- \$520,000 total funds available this year

#### Design Projects

The funding cap for a Design Project depends on the project's budget and the number of members per project. It is the **lesser** of two:

#### Professional Development (PD) Opportunities

PAF funds Professional Development opportunities that aim to advance students' knowledge and skills. Examples of past sessions include networking nights and seminar series.

Funding shall be awarded based on the following guidelines:

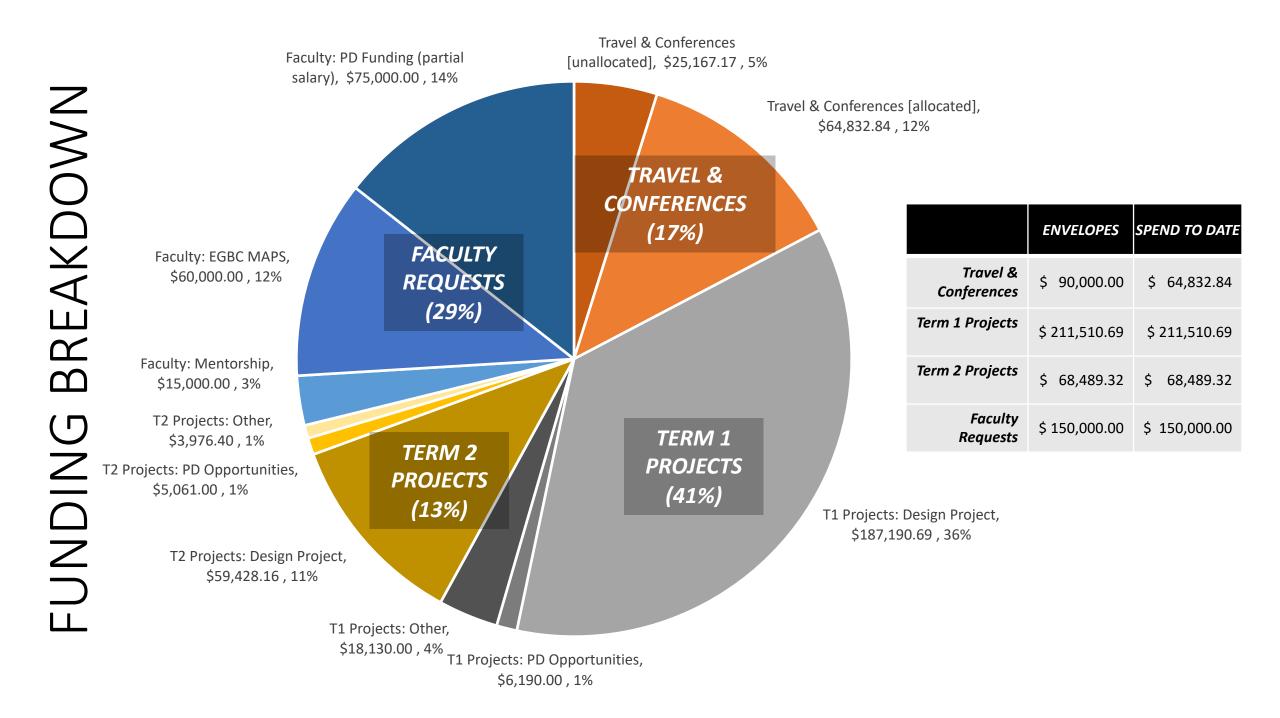
- PAF Funding shall not exceed 70% of the project's budget
- Food shall be subsidized at a rate of \$6/expected engineering attendee (students and industry). Attendance numbers should be briefly justified.
- The lesser of \$500 or 70% of the costs for venue and associate venue fees (table, chairs, etc.)
- Thank you gifts for speakers will be subsidized up to \$50 per speaker

#### Other

Other projects are those that do not fall into the above two categories. Funding for these projects is awarded based on the discretion of the funding committee, and should fall in line with past funding given to similar projects.

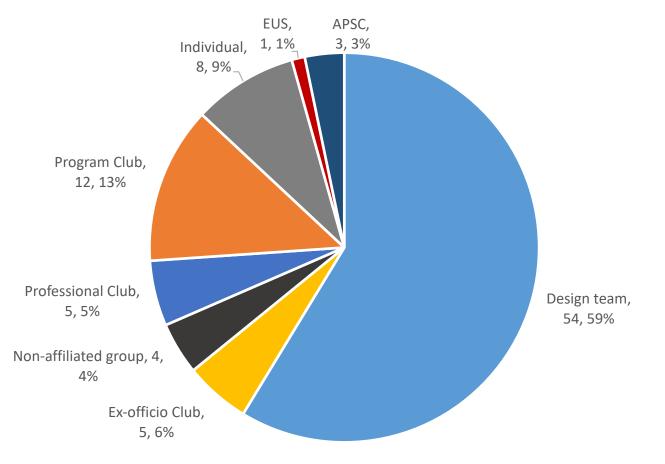
The committee uses the following guidelines when awarding funding:

- Funding should be appropriate for the number of UBC Engineering students benefitting from this professional development experience.
- Funding shall not exceed the lesser of 50% of the project's budget or \$10,000.

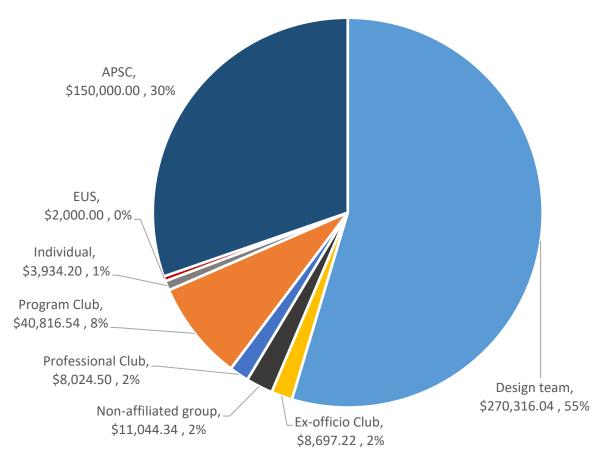


### DISTRIBUTION PER GROUP

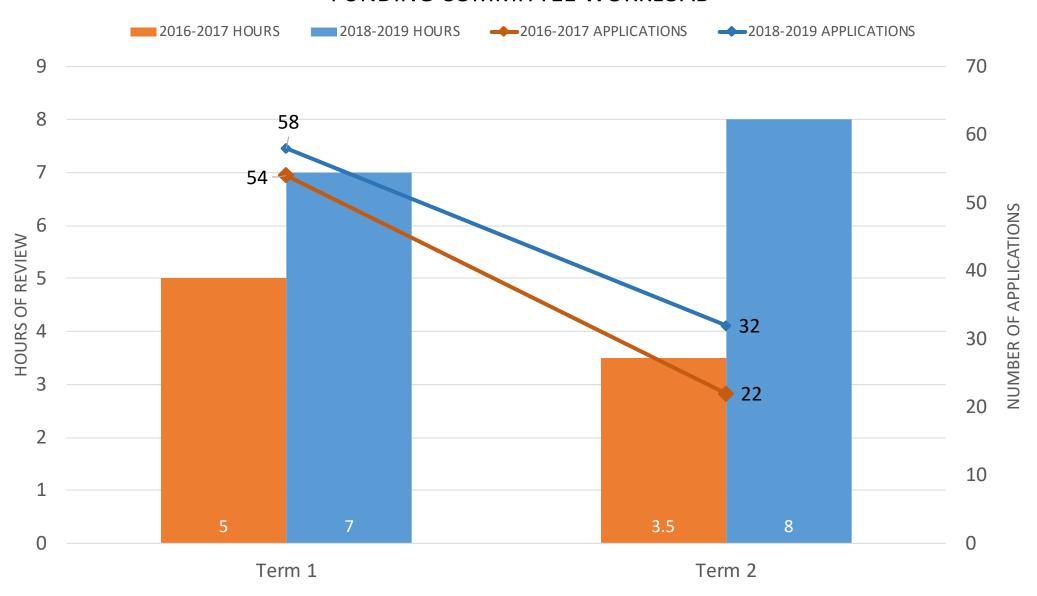
#### SPREAD OF APPLICATION SOURCES

### PAF USAGE STATS

#### TRAVEL & CONFERENCES

- Number of beneficiaries: 316
- Average PAF per beneficiary: \$207.07
- Average percentage of PAF for total income: 15.7%

#### PROJECTS (T2 ONLY)

- Number of beneficiaries: 1034
- Average PAF per beneficiary: \$66.24
  - Design projects: \$141.12/beneficiary;
     19% budget
  - PD Events: \$8.26/beneficiary; 4% budget
  - Other: \$233.23/beneficiary; 35% budget
- Average percentage of PAF for total income: 19%

NOTE: These values are purely self-reported values.

### PAF Challenges

- Lots of administrative turnover leads to inconsistency year-to-year.
- Balancing access to fund between different interest groups when setting envelopes and funding criteria.
- Increasing numbers of applications and increasing number of groups applying to PAF (we have more student teams than we used to have).
- Mostly steady size pool of funding (although can be somewhat hard to predict amount as it is only charged when students increase in academic standing) means we end up scaling applications down when we get more each year.
- Increased number of resubmissions required this year.
- Greater administrative burden with more applications and more resubmissions.

### Updates to PAF for 2019-2020

- Mandate EUS President to sit on PAF Funding Committee.
- Streamlining application form to reduce burden on reviewers.
- Re-modelling funding caps for certain categories to try to reduce scaling.
- Considering changing fee assessment schedule to have PAF charged annually rather than only when students change academic year standing. Exploring possibility of opt-outs for those on non-Vancouver co-op terms for the academic year.
- Exploring removal of representative/non-representative categories.
